of my property and secondly my will is that my lands  
remain to those to whom I have given it and again  
of my negroes, I give and bequeath to my daughter  
Mary Pitman a negro man Tier in Mississippi under  
the management of my son Hewitt Pittman I give this negro  
to my daughter Mary Pitman for her use and benefit  
during her natural life subject to the management and  
supervision of my son William Pitman and at her death  
to return and be subject to the disposal hereafter made

ful if my daughter Mary shall have issue of her body, then  
 the said negroes are to remain to her and her issue forever.  
 And again I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary  
 Pitman my son William Pitman to my daughter Rhoda  
 Allen wife of Thompson H. Allen to my son Thomas Pitman  
 and my daughter Sarah Ann Rogers wife of Dew Rogers  
 my negro woman Fench my negro girl Lathime my negro  
 boy Jerry my negro girl Sincy and negro child Lier  
 and all their future increase together with all my personal  
 property of all kind, and dispositions to them to  
 be equal and alike with the exception that my daughter  
 Mary my son William my son Thomas and daughter  
 Sarah Ann shall get fifty dollar more than my daughter  
 Rhoda Allen, and further my will is that the property  
 here given to my daughter Mary be subject to the same  
 conditions as the negro man Lier first given and the  
 part herein given and the negro man Lier first named  
 given to my daughter Mary shall in the event she  
 has no issue go to my son William my daughter Rhoda  
 my son Thomas and my daughter Sarah Ann to  
 share and share alike, and lastly I ordain and  
 constitute my son William Pitman my executor  
 to this my last will and testament, In witness  
 whereof I have hereunto set my hand on the day  
 and in the year first above written as my last  
 will and testament revoking all other  
 wills and testaments

I Amy Pitman of the state of South Carolina and District of Marion being of sound mind and memory and being desirous of disposing of my earthly substance do make and ordain this my last will and Testament on this the Sixteenth day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty seven in manner and form following vis - First my desire and will is that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid out of my property and secondly my will is that my lands remain to those to whom I have given it and again of my negroes I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Pitman my negro man Sier in Mifflin under the management of my son Hewitt Pitman I give this negro to my daughter Mary for her use and benefit during her natural life subject to the management and supervision of my son W<sup>m</sup> Pitman and at her death to return and be subject to the disposal hereafter made but if my daughter Mary shall have issue of her body then the said negro Sier to remain to her and her issue forever. And again I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Pitman my son William Pitman to my daughter Rhoda Allen wife of Thompson W Allen to my son Thomas Pitman and my daughter Sarah Ann Rogers wife of Dew Rogers my negro woman Temah my negro girl Catherine my negro boy Jerry my negro girl Lincy and negro child Sier and all their future increase together with all my personale property of all kinds and descriptions to them to Share equal and alike with the exception that My daughter Mary My son William my son Thomas and daughter Sarah Ann shall get Fifty dollars more than the my daughter Rhoda Allen- And to my further my will is that property here given to my daughter Mary be subject to the same Condition as the negro man Sier first given and the part herein given and the negro man Sier first named given to my daughter mary shall in the event that she has no issue go to my son William my daughter Reda My son Thomas and my daughter Sarah Ann to Share and Share alike And lastly I ordain and constitute my son W<sup>m</sup> Pitman my executor to this my last will and Testament In Witnes whereof I have hereunto set my hand on the day and in the year first above written as my last will and Testament revoking all Others
