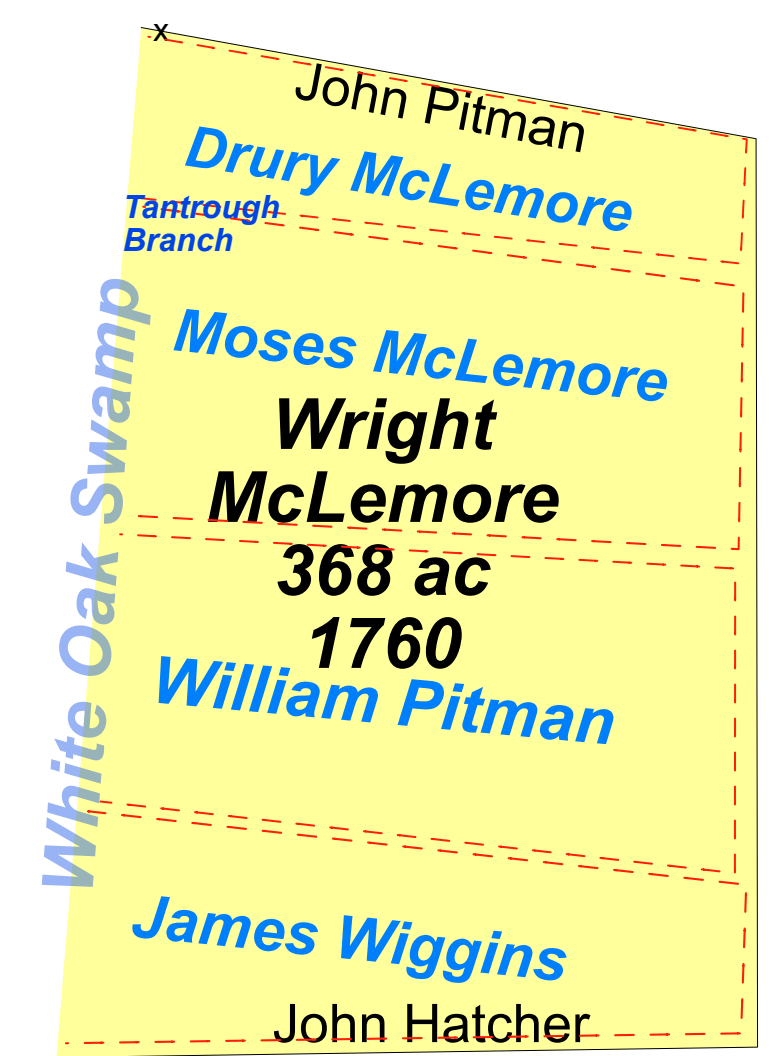
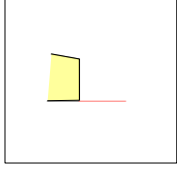

*Wright McLemore three hundred and sixty eight
 acres of land in Edgecombe County beginning at a black Gum in
 white oak swamp then south 80 E 198 pds along John Pitmans
 line to a black oak then south 898 pds to a pine in a branch
 then N 290 pds along John Hatcher's line to a live oak in the
 said swamp then up the swamp to the first station (a live
 oak) 28th day of June 1760*

begin x White Oak Swamp
 S 80 E 198 along John Pitman Line
 S 290 to a pine in a branch
 W 218 along John Hatcher line to sd swamp
 then up swamp to 1st



*Surveyed the 10th February 1760
 For Wright McLemore a Tract of
 Land containing Three hundred and
 Sixty eight acres in the County of Edge-
 combe and Province of North Carolina begin-
 ning at a black Gum in white oak swamp
 then N 290 pds along John Hatcher's line
 to a black oak then S 898 pds
 to a pine in a branch then N 218
 pds along John Hatcher's line
 to a live oak in the said swamp
 then up the swamp to the first
 station
 according to the plan made
 sworn Chain carriers
 Drury McLemore for Haywood
 William Goodwin*

 between Wright McLemore of the County of Edgecombe of the one part and
 James Wiggins of the said County of Edgecombe of the other part
 witnesseth that the said Wright McLemore for and in consideration of the sum of five pounds
 current money to him in hand paid by the said James Wiggins
 the Receipt whereof he hath acknowledged and by these Presents
 hath granted sold bargained sold conveyed and by these Presents
 hath confirmed conveyed and made over unto the said James
 Wiggins a certain Tract or Parcel of Land of one hundred and
 thirty six or thereabouts lying in the County of Edgecombe the Part of
 a Swamp beginning at the mouth of a Branch on the back line
 to the beginning of the mouth of said Branch and then along the
 back line to a Pine then along the other marked line to a
 small Branch then down the said Branch to a white Oak
 Swamp thence up the said Swamp to the Beginning*

 witnesseth that the said Wright McLemore for and in consideration of the sum of
 twenty pounds current money to me in hand paid...
 has sold unto Moses McLemore...land
 a certain Tract or Parcel of Land of one hundred and thirty six or thereabouts
 lying in the County of Edgecombe the Part of a Swamp beginning at the mouth
 of a Branch on the back line to the beginning of the mouth of said Branch
 and then along the back line to a Pine then along the other marked line to a
 small Branch then down the said Branch to a white Oak Swamp thence up the
 said Swamp to the Beginning*

"This Indenture made between Moses McLemore ...of the one part
 & Wright McLemore... of the other part..."
 This is a bit confusing but it irons out that Wright is selling to Moses.

"twenty pounds current money...to me in hand paid...
 has ...sold unto Moses McLemore...land"

begin x mouth of **Tantrough Branch**
 in White Oak Swamp
 then up branch to corner (between Drury McLemore
 and Wright McLemore)
 then to a corner (between Wm Pitman & the sd Wright)
 then by his other line to an oak in a small branch
 then down the branch ...obscured.
 ...then the several courses of the swamp 1to 1st

**By 1766 he had sold
 all but 10 acres
 of his patent of 368 acres**

**All of this makes me suspect
 that Wright McLemore
 is settling his affairs prior to
 dying...hence, there is no
 real need for a will... the
 remaining 10 acres (which he
 may be retired upon) will
 devolve to the oldest son
 by primogeniture. This era is
 still English Law.**
