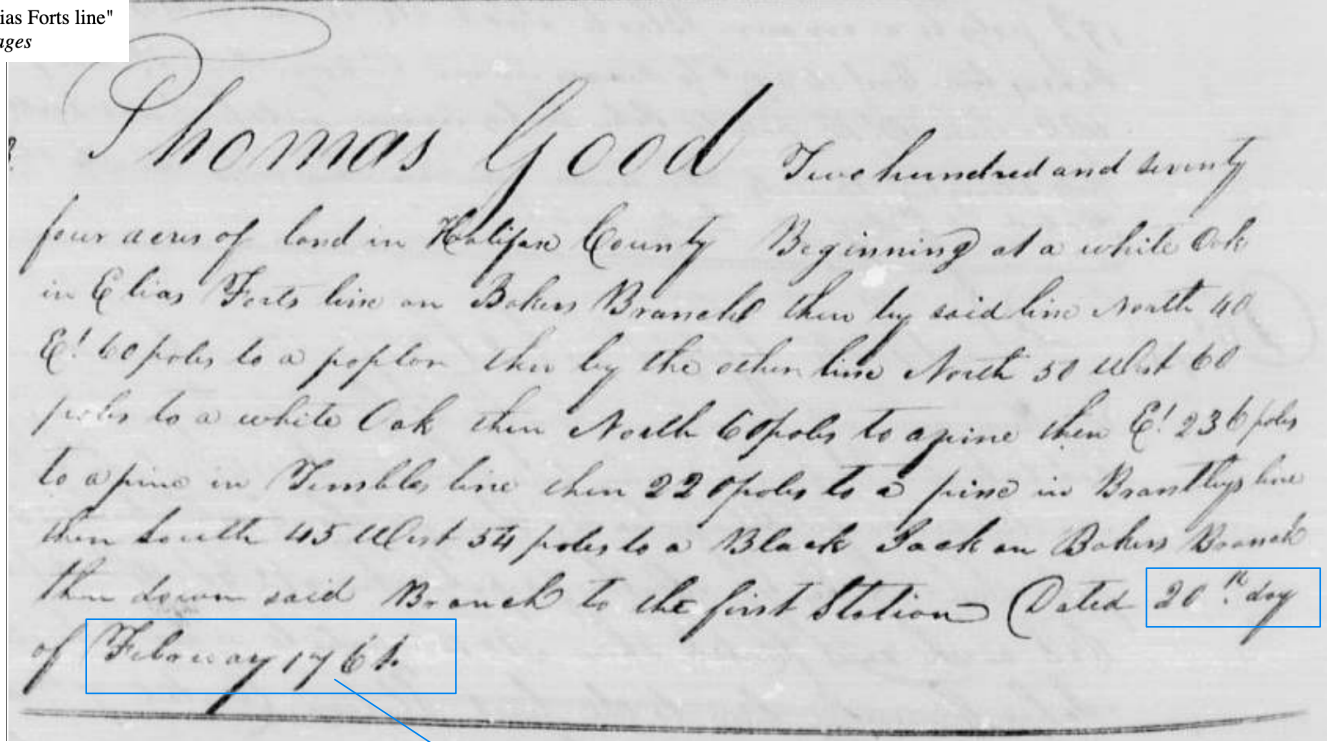


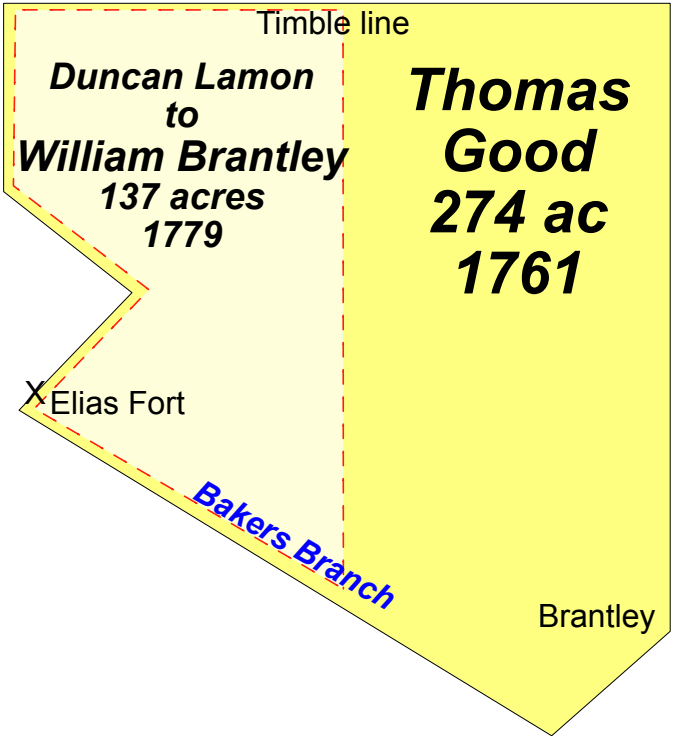
Halifax Co. File No. 76, Thomas Good
Issued 20 Feb 1761 for 274 acres "Beginning at a white oak in Elias Forts line on Bakers Branch then by said line North 40 E 60 poles to a poplar then by the other line North 50 West 60 poles to a white Oak then North 60 poles to a pine then E 236 poles to a pine in Timble line then 220 poles to a pine in Brantleys line then South 45 West 54 poles to a Black Oak on Bakers Branch then down said Branch to the first Station (Dated 20th day of February 1761)

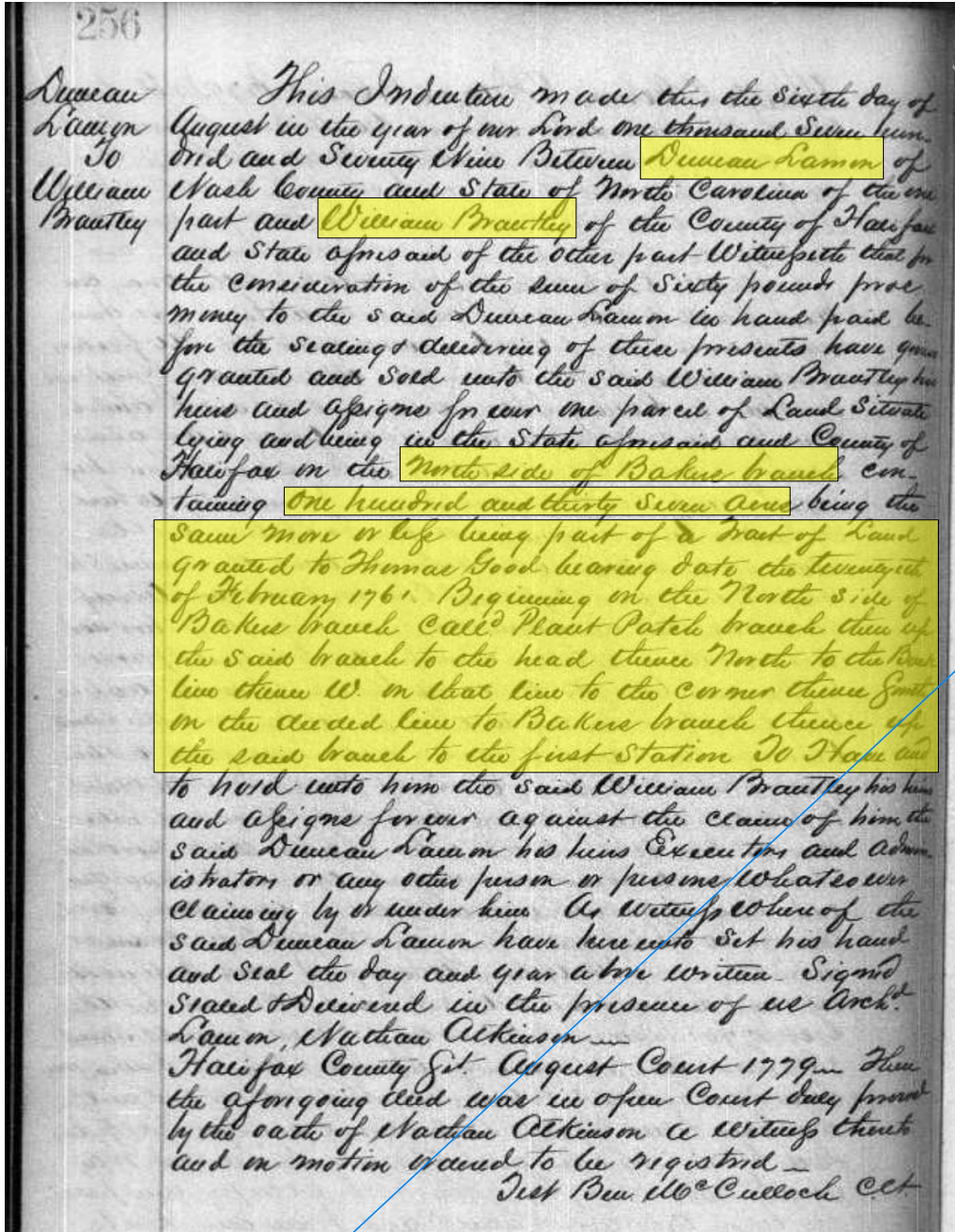
