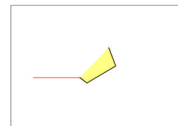

This Indenture made the nineteenth day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and forty seven between James Bryant of Edgecombe County in the Province of North Carolina Plaintiff of the one part and George Reaves of Brunswick County in the Colony of Virginia Plaintiff of the other part Witnesseth that the said James Bryant for and in consideration of the sum of twenty two pounds current money of Virginia to him in hand paid by the said George Reaves the receipt whereof the said James Bryant both hereby acknowledge he the said James Bryant hath granted bargained and sold conveyed and confirmed and by these presents doth grant bargain & sell alien and confirm unto the said George Reaves his heirs and assigns forever all that my Land containing two hundred acres lying and being in the County of Brunswick bounded as followeth vizt. on the South side of Tar River Beginning in the bent of the said River against his Father Thomas Bryants plantation then along down the River S 20 E 140 Pole to William Bryants Corner white oak on the said River then along his line S 60 W 230 Pole to a Gum in a branch Webb's Run then along the said branch N 55 W 60 to a Sycamore on the said River thence down the various courses of the said River to the first station being granted by Patent to James Bryant bearing date the 20th of April 1745 Together with all trees Woods underwoods Common Common of pasture profits Commodities advantages Hereditaments Ways waters and Appurtenances the Reversion and Reversions Remainder and Reservations Rents and services of the said premises and every part thereof and all the Estate right Title Interest Claim and Demand whatsoever of him the said James Bryant of us and to the said Land and premises and every part thereof To Have and to hold the said Land and all and singular the premises above mentioned and every part and parcel thereof with the Appurtenances unto the said George Reaves his heirs and assigns to the only proper use and behoof of the said George Reaves his heirs and assigns forever & the said James Bryant for him and his heirs the said Land and premises and every part thereof against him and his heirs and of all or other person and persons whatsoever claiming or to claim by form or equity him or them or any of them to the said George Reaves his heirs and assigns shall and will warrant and forever defend by these presents. North Carolina } *This Indenture made the twenty fifth day of April in the year of our Lord God one thousand seven hundred and forty seven between Thomas Weiraine of the one part & John Simmonds of the other part Witnesseth that the said Thomas Weiraine for and in consideration of the sum of six pounds current money of Virginia to him in hand paid at and before the making and delivery of the receipt hereof the said Thomas Weiraine both hereby acknowledge and thereof and thence from both parties quit and discharge the said John Simmonds his heirs Executors Admrs. and assigns whatsoever granted bargained sold & allowed & confirmed and by these presents doth give grant sell and confirm unto the said John Simmonds his heirs and assigns forever one certain tract of Land lying and being in the Province and County aforesaid in the South side of Haynes Branch containing fifty acres be the same more or less Beginning at a white oak on Weiraine Simmonds line thence to a Hickory thence to a Red oak thence to Haynes Branch and so down the various courses of the said branch to the first station as by patent granted to the said Thomas Weiraine dated the twenty sixth day of July Anno Dom. 1743. Together with all houses orchards gardens ways woods underwoods water and water courses and all other appurtenances and conveniences therunto belonging or appertaining to the said Land with the Reversion and Reversions Remainder and Reservations thereof and every part thereof to him the said John Simmonds his heirs and assigns forever and further the said Thomas Weiraine his Exr. Adm. doth covenant and agree to and with the said John Simmonds his heirs and assigns that the said Thomas Weiraine will make and execute such further and other conveyances or assurances in the Law for the better confirming or sure making the premises to the said John Simmonds*
