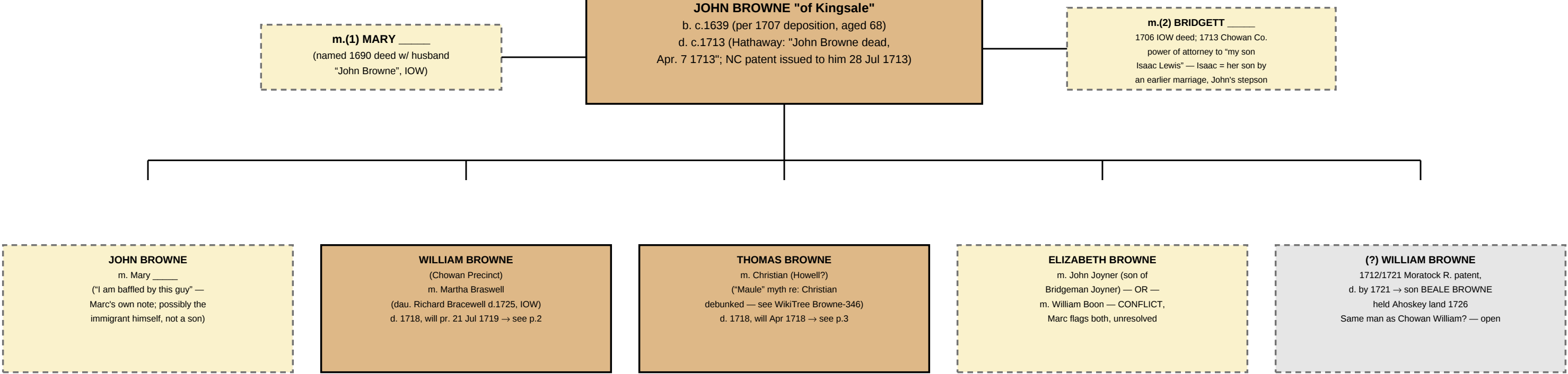


John Browne of Kingsale, 1639-1713 — Indian Trader

Isle of Wight Co., VA (~~Blackwater River / Kingsale Swamp~~) → ~~relocated near Wicaccan Creek~~ Chowan Precinct, NC by c.1710



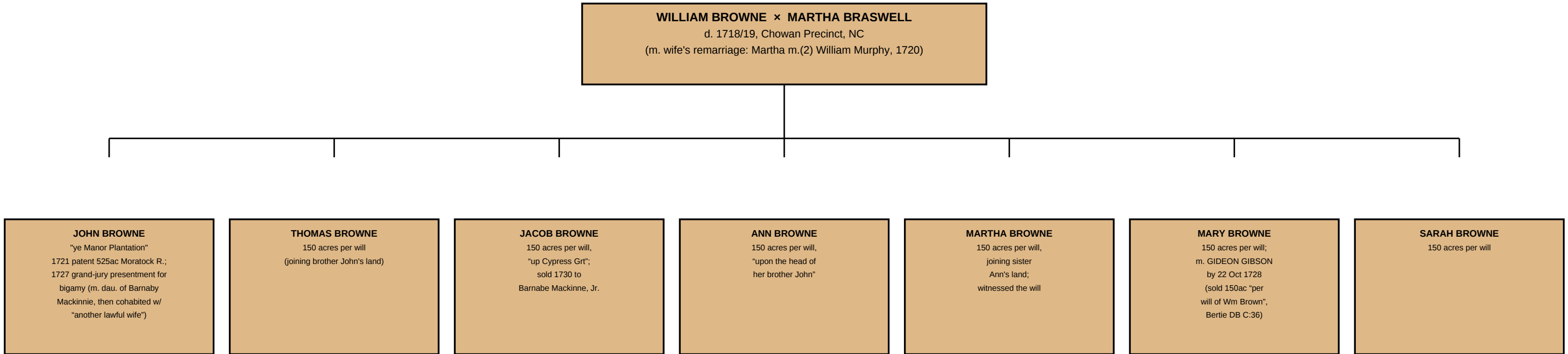
Legend:

Notes: Marc's own list ("I speculate that John Browne (Indian Trader) had children:") names the four solid boxes at left-of-center on this row; the fifth (grey, right) is a separate thread Marc raises but never merges with the others — a William Browne with an independent 1712/1721 Moratock River patent whose son Beale Browne later held the Ahoskey tract. Whether this is the SAME William Browne as the Chowan-Precinct William (m. Martha Braswell, tan box) is left an open identity question in the source post and is NOT assumed here. Ruled-out / distinct Brownes (shipwright son-in-law of Wm. Boddie; Pasquotank John Browne 1698/99; Dr. Samuel Browne of Southampton; a third John Browne d.1718 with no heirs) are compiled on page 3.

Descendants of William Browne (Chowan Precinct) & Martha Braswell

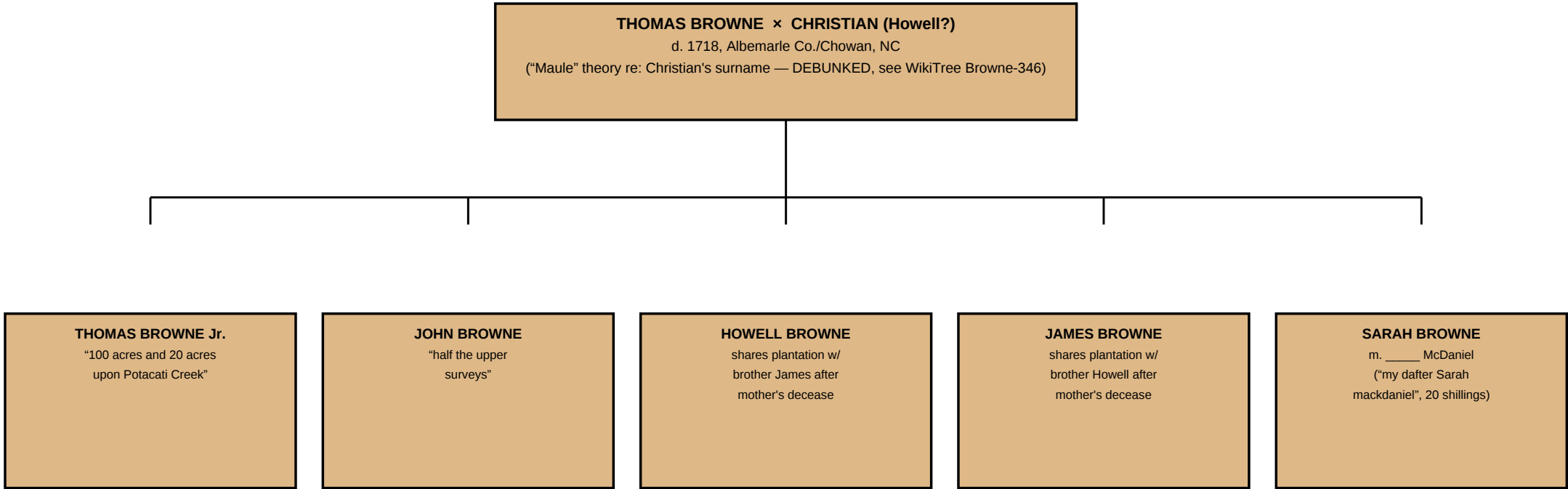
Will dated 15 Dec 1718, proved 21 Jul 1719, Chowan Co., NC (wife unnamed in will; identified elsewhere as Martha, dau. Richard Bracewell d.1725 IOW)



This generation is the most solidly documented tier in the whole compilation — all seven names and their 150-acre shares come directly from William Browne's own 1718 will (proved Chowan Precinct, 21 Jul 1719). Son John's 1727 bigamy presentment (NC General Court, Bertie precinct) and daughter Mary's marriage to Gideon Gibson (a free man of color who settled near the Roanoke River c.1720, later prominent in Halifax/Northampton Co.) are both corroborated by separate, independent deed and court records cited in the source post — doxa-level for this generation, distinct from the more speculative Gen.1→Gen.2 link on page 1.

Descendants of Thomas Browne & Christian (Howell?)

Will dated Apr. 1718, proved Oct. 1718, Chowan Co., NC — plus associate / ruled-out Brownes discussed in the source post

As with page 2, this generation's five children come directly from Thomas Browne's own 1718 will. The "Maule" theory for wife Christian's maiden name is explicitly flagged in the source post as debunked per peer review at WikiTree (Browne-346). The grey panel at right lists every other "John/William/Samuel Browne" the source post investigates and then explicitly separates from this family — included here only so a future reader doesn't re-open a thread Marc already closed.

Truth-standard note: Gen.1 (p.1) is Marc's own explicitly-labeled theory/speculation — OPINION, not doxa. Gen.2 (pp.2-3, tan boxes) is will-documented — doxa-level for parentage and shares, though the link of these two wills back up to John Browne of Kingsale himself remains the unproven hinge of the whole chart.

of Southampton Co., VA, will 1739;
"no connection that I can see" — Marc
- JOHN BROWNE (d.1718)
m. widow w/ son Jacob Pritchard,
left no heirs — unconnected
